Group Debates International Standards for Higher Education

At a recent meeting of the Council for Higher Education's International Quality Group, members discussed the idea of developing one set of global standards for quality assurance and accreditation to address the rise in student mobility and the need for adequate evaluation of educational experiences abroad.

Among the benefits discussed in regards to the establishment of a single set of quality standards was that such international standards would help to facilitate transnational education and enable greater collaboration between higher education institutions around the world, with students assured of the quality, equivalence and portability of degrees.

One of the drawbacks of such a system is the danger that, in efforts to comply with international standards, higher education systems could become less relevant to the socio-cultural needs of local communities, leaving local needs under-served.

A single set of standards would require unanimity and consensus, would need to recognize the uniqueness of different countries and institutions, and would need to avoid the same standards of excellence for all institutions.

DHS Releases Report on the US Nonimmigrant Population

This report presents estimates of the size and characteristics of the resident nonimmigrant population in the United States. The estimates are daily averages for the 12-month period centered on January 1, 2012. In this report, the term resident nonimmigrant refers to foreign nationals who are legally admitted into the United States for specific, temporary purposes and whose classes of admission are associated with residency (e.g., students and temporary workers, as opposed to tourists and business travelers). The characteristics analyzed include category of admission, country of citizenship, age, sex, and destination state. The estimates are derived from U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) administrative records of nonimmigrant arrivals and departures.



Joanne Waghorne, Professor of Religion at Syracuse University will discuss *Hindu Gurus Moving Up: New Sites for Spiritual Practices in Singapore*.

Singapore led Asia in the development of a high-rise world with its largely successful scheme of owner-occupied government-built housing. These high-rises nurture some surprising Hindu-inspired movements in spite of arguments that such an environment supposedly kills the human spirit. All these events are Hindu in flavor but often explicitly above ethnicity and even "religion." What kind of religiosity flourishes in this soon-to-be dominant spatial régime in Asia? One answer: Hindu gurus, but how and why?


Filmmaker Kiarostami to Hold Residency in VPA Events throughout April
