Gather at the bus stop on University Place (between Bird Library and Schine Student Center) to catch the 11:23 AM bus. There is a \$2 cost for the bus, and you must have the exact amount (If you give the bus driver a \$5 bill, you will not get change). If you miss that bus, there is another bus immediately afterwards, at 11:25 a.m. The parade begins at 12 noon, and lasts three hours. You may leave anytime. There are buses going back to campus about every 30 minutes. There will be a \$2 cost on the return trip as well.

The parade is fun, and you may buy food, drinks and souvenirs if you so choose. Wear something green! (Some people wear all GREEN!)
